Executive Summary

The City holds its election for Mayor and City Council in May of each year. The election for the Positions of Councilmembers 1, 2, and 3 are held in even numbered years and this year was initially called for May 2, 2020. All incumbents filed for their positions and Position 1 had an additional applicant resulting in a May Election.

As a result of the COVID 19 Pandemic, the City Council voted in March to postpone the May 2, 2020 Election to the November Election Date in accordance with the Governor's Proclamation.

Following the action to postpone, one of the candidates for Position 1 withdrew his application. As a result, the November Election was cancelled as no additional candidates could be added to the ballot.

With the withdrawal, there was no opposition and all incumbents were considered elected.

These Councilmembers will take their oath of office at the November Meeting.

Item B.

The Police Department has notified the City that the City's Health Insurance Provider, Blue Cross & Blue Shield has provided a credit for all employees from the October medical premiums. This City's credit totaled \$507.08 for 7 employees who were covered in October 2020. This item allows acceptance of the funds and will be divided between the City's General and Utility Funds as the insurance premiums are prorated by fund based on the employee.

Item C.

Several neighborhoods in the City have inquired about installing additional ALPR systems on individual streets. In discussion with Memorial Villages Police Department and the City of Hunters Creek, Hunters Creek has implemented an ordinance that provides this opportunity. Residents will need to enter into an agreement with MVPD's contractor and the City will allow and approve the placement of the pole and equipment on the City's right of way. The residents will pay any costs and MVPD will operate the system. Staff recommends adoption of this ordinance to provide this partnership opportunity.

Follow-up on Previous Month Items/Requests from Commission

- Created first draft of IT RFP for review.
- Annual vehicle expense review and summary were completed.

Personnel Changes/Issues/Updates

- Officer Schanmier remains on sick leave due to a broken foot.
- Officer Miller continues to support patrol efforts 4 days a week while D.A.R.E. remains as a virtual class for SBISD students.

Major/Significant Events

- During the month of October, we saw a significant increase in the number of fraud and identity theft cases. Specifically, in the number of fraudulent claims for unemployment benefits being filed with the Texas Workforce Commission and for fraudulent applications for loans with the Small Business Administration. CID detectives have established a working relationship with the TWC and are coordinating efforts on the mounting number of cases.
- This month the department recovered our 50th stolen vehicle of the year from an ALPR hit at the US Coins ALPR Camera and reached our \$1,000,000 in 2020 recovered value of stolen vehicles with a hit on one of our Voss ALPR cameras. Ironically, both vehicles were 2018 Jeep Renegades which are some of the top Houston stolen vehicles for 2019/2020.
- On October 14th we had 3 crimes occur within a 90-minute timeframe. All 3 property crimes were committed by the same individuals and occurred in the Voss corridor. MVPD was able to develop a lead in the crimes by utilizing the ALPR system. Through investigation we linked our cases to others that have occurred in Houston and the Constables area of responsibility. The suspects are part of crime ring of gypsies from north Harris County. Detectives are working with HPD on the group of serial criminals. Update: The suspect vehicle was spotted by MVPD personnel on the Katy frontage road. HPD assisted and after a short pursuit two suspects were taken into custody. The suspects are gypsies from the Virginia/Maryland area. It is anticipated that over 20 crimes will be solved as a result of the arrests.

Status Update on any Major Projects

- The 3 new 2020 marked police units are nearing completion. The upfitter is hoping to deliver the units the week of 11/9/20.
- The 2021 police units were ordered as per the approval of the Commission. We are hoping to receive the new units in February of 2021.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-540

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS, AMENDING ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADD A NEW DIVISION 3, PRIVATE SECURITY CAMERAS, TO ARTICLE V, RIGHT-OF-WAY MANAGEMENT, OF CHAPTER 13, STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN DEFINITIONS, AND ALLOWING PRIVATE SECURITY CAMERAS IN THE CITY'S RIGHTS-OF-WAY WHEN SUCH CAMERA IS IN CONJUNCTION WITH AN AGREEMENT WITH THE MEMORIAL VILLAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.00 FOR EVERY VIOLATION HEREOF, WITH EACH DAY CONSTITUTING A SEPARATE VIOLATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND MAKING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to facilitate cooperation between the Memorial Village Police Department and the City's residents to provide additional automated license plate recognition ("ALPR") cameras in the City; and

WHEREAS, the Memorial Village Police Department is in a position to coordinate with City staff in the installation of ALPR cameras within the City's rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens to allow private security cameras as set forth in this ordinance; now, therefor,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS:

Section 1. The facts and matters contained in the preamble of this ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.

Section 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas is hereby amended by adding a new Division 3, Private Security Cameras, to Article V, Right-of-Way Management, of Chapter 13, Streets and Sidewalks, such Division 3 to read as follows:

"Division 3. Private Security Cameras.

Section 13-118. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Emergency shall mean a situation where a significant risk of harm to persons or property will occur unless immediate remedial action is taken.

Police department shall mean the Memorial Village Police Department.

Private security camera shall mean a recording device for capturing images or video that is owned or operated by a private citizen or entity and installed at a specific location, but does not include a handheld or other portable camera.

Section 13-119 – Exceptions for certain public safety cameras.

Except as provided below, private security cameras that are placed and maintained in the public right-of-way pursuant to a written security camera operating agreement between the owner or lessee of the camera and the Memorial Villages Police Department are permitted.

- (a) The City may require the removal or relocation of a private security camera because of a potential conflict with a public utility or other lawful use of the right-of-way or as necessary for the safety of vehicles or pedestrians.
- (b) The City shall have the right to remove a private security camera, without notice to the owner of the private security camera, in the event of an emergency and the City will not be liable for damages or the cost of replacement.
- (c) The owner or lessee of the private security camera must either own the fee in the property underlying the public right-of-way, or have the written permission of the owner of the underlying fee to place and maintain a private security camera at the desired location.
- (d) The location of the private security camera and related materials must be approved by the City Administrator or Director of Public Works.
- **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
- Section 4. Repeal. This Ordinance is intended to be cumulative and shall not repeal any provision of a previous ordinance or City Code except to the extent that a provision is inconsistent and cannot be reconciled with this ordinance.

Section 5. Penalty. Any person who intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with criminal negligence violates any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a

misdemeanor and upon conviction be ordered to pay a fine up to \$2,000.00 per violation, with

each day constituting a new violation.

Section 6. Severability. In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence, or part of

this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason

be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is the intention

of the City Council that the invalidity or unconstitutionality of the one or more parts shall not

affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision other than the part

declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village,

Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the

omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or

more parts.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-539

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS EXTENDING A PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY AND EXTENDING A STATE OF DISASTER DUE TO THE OUTBREAK OF COVID-19; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

* * * * * *

WHEREAS, Greg Abbott, Governor of the State of Texas, entered a declaration of disaster on March 13, 2020 as a result of the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, Harris County Judge, Lina Hidalgo, entered a stay home, work safe order for all of Harris County on March 24, 2020 to last until April 3, 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2020, Judge Hidalgo extended the stay home, work safe order until April 30, 2020 and has continued orders to date; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas issued a disaster declaration on March 24, 2020 and approved on April 21, 2020, May 19, 2020, June 16, 2020, August 18, 2020, September 15, 2020 and October 20, 2020 an extension to the order; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas will continue to follow the Governor's direction for the extension of this emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas finds it to be in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to extend this declaration of disaster for an additional sixty three (63) days; and

WHEREAS, by this Declaration, the City Council declares all rules and regulations that may inhibit or prevent prompt response to this threat suspended for the duration of the incident; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted to the Mayor under the Texas Disaster Act, the Mayor, with the consent of Council authorizes the use of all available resources of state government and political subdivisions to assist in the City's response to this situation; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS:

Section 1. The facts and matters contained in the preamble to this ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.

- <u>Section 2.</u> Extension of Local State of Disaster. That the local state of disaster and public health emergency previously declared for the City of Bunker Hill Village pursuant to §418.108 of the Texas Disaster Act is hereby extended for 63 days from the date of this ordinance or unless terminated or modified by earlier ordinance of the City.
- <u>Section 3.</u> Publicity and Filing. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration of a local state of disaster due to this public health emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
- Section 4. Activation of the City Emergency Management Plan. Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration of a local state of disaster due to this public health emergency activates the City of Bunker Hill Village Emergency Management Plan.
- Section 5. Temporary Housing and Emergency Shelter. Pursuant to §418.020(d) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration authorizes the City to: (1) temporarily or permanently acquire by lease, purchase, or other means sites required for temporary housing units or emergency shelters for disaster victims; and (2) enter into arrangements necessary to prepare or equip the sites for installation and use of temporary housing units or emergency shelters, including arrangements necessary for the transportation and purchase of temporary housing units or emergency shelters.
- Section 6. In the event any clause phrase, provision, sentence, or part of this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

<u>Section 7</u>. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
